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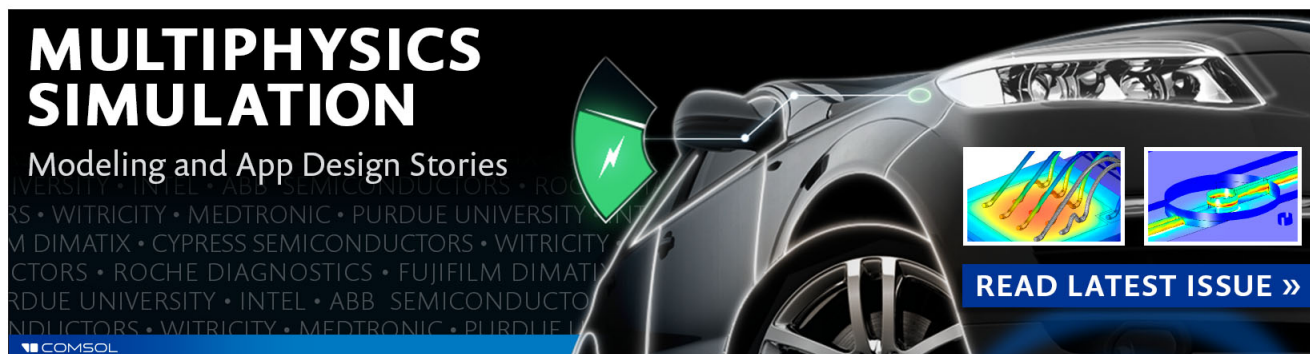
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## Erratum: “Nonlinear organic plasmonics: Applications to optical control of Coulomb blocking in nanojunctions” [Appl. Phys. Lett. 107, 053302 (2015)]

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The following misprint was revealed after the paper<sup>1</sup> appeared in print: the term “(−1)” to the power “*j*” on the right-hand side of Eq. (4). The correct power is “*j* + 1,” i.e., the corresponding term is bound to be “(−1)<sup>*j*+1</sup>.” The correct Eq. (4) is shown below

$$\varepsilon(\Omega, t) = 1 + ip\eta \sqrt{\frac{\pi}{2\sigma_{2s}}} \sum_{j=1,2} (-1)^{j+1} n_j(t) w \left[ \frac{\Omega - \omega_{21} + p\Delta n(t) + \delta_{2j}\omega_{st}}{\sqrt{2\sigma_{2s}}} \right]. \quad (4)$$

The misprint does not affect our results and conclusions, since all the calculations in the paper (including numerical simulations) were done using the correct power “*j* + 1.”
